Re: Harvest plan near Beals' Brook

Dear Mr. Rushton

I am writing to request a status report regarding harvest plan AP068499, a 24 hectare forest near Beal's Brook in Annapolis County.

The forest in question is a vital wildlife corridor in an area of wetlands surrounded by clear-cuts. Three endangered species have been observed in the area: Mainland moose, pine marten and wood turtle.

WestFor's plan to log this stand of 80 year old trees must be positioned in the context of the nearby clear-cut landscape of Annapolis County.

Stop this plan in the interest of leaving a bit of ecologically-healthy forest as a seed source for future forests, for next generations and wildlife.

In your interview with the CBC radio on December 8th, you committed then to reviewing all unexecuted harvest plans on the books to ensure they adhere to Lahey's guidelines. You noted, "There could be plans that do have to be amended. I'm not hiding that fact as the minister."

Harvest plan AP068499 should be amended. No harvest should take place in this forest. Instead, it should be placed under consideration for protection due to its high value to wildlife and the displacement of wildlife by clear-cutting in the surrounding landscape.

The protected leg of the triad is set to expand substantially. Your mandate letter requires you to work with the Minister of Environment and Climate Change to protect at least 20% of the total land and water mass of Nova Scotia by 2030.
